2024 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (RTIP) DEVELOPMENT AND SCHEDULE

PREPARED BY: Iván Garcia, Programming Director

ISSUE: BCAG is required to prepare and adopt a Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) by December 15, 2023, for the 2024 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). BCAG issued a "call for projects" on July 10, 2023 for new programming considerations.

DISCUSSION: The purpose of the RTIP is to identify programming recommendations for the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The 2024 STIP will cover the next five fiscal years beginning July 1, 2024 (FYs 24/25-28/29). The STIP is adopted by the California Transportation Commission (CTC) and is comprised of two components including the Regional Improvement Program and Interregional Improvement Program.

STIP Components:

- 1) 75% <u>Regional Improvement Program (RIP)</u>. Projects nominated by the Regional Transportation Planning Agencies (RTPAs) like BCAG as part of the Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP Document)
- 2) 25% <u>Interregional Improvement Program (IIP)</u>. Projects nominated by Caltrans as part of their Interregional Transportation Improvement Program (ITIP).

<u>Funding</u>

Every two years, Caltrans prepares a "Fund Estimate" (FE) identifying the amount of funding available to regions for new projects. The STIP Regional Improvement Program for the region include:

Requirements for ALL Projects

BCAG has identified 4 requirements for new project programming consideration. These requirements are defined in the STIP guidelines.

- Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy All projects are required to be included in the current <u>Regional Transportation</u> Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (RTP/SCS).
- **Project Study Reports** A complete project study report (PSR) or, for a project that is not on a State highway, a PSR equivalent.
- Criteria for Measuring Performance and Cost-Effectiveness Depending on the project, an appropriate level of performance metric demonstration is required. The criterion in the guidelines aims to capture: vehicle miles traveled (VMT) reductions, air quality benefits, mode shift, distance to transit service and safety benefits as relevant to the project.
- ePPR An Electronic Project Programming Request (ePPR) form is required.
 This electronic form identifies the basic scope, benefits, funding, and schedule for the proposed project. The ePPR can be generated thru CalSMART at: https://calsmart.dot.ca.gov/.

BCAG Project Criteria Evaluation

Evaluation criteria will be based on the goals of the Climate Action Plan for Transportation Infrastructure (CAPTI) built from the Governor's Executive Orders (EO) EO N-19-19 and N-79-20. These Executive Orders and the CAPTI are the basis for which ALL transportation funding is programmed thru BCAG. Additionally, BCAG is required to report progress on the Federal Performance Measures to FHWA and to California Air Resources Board (CARB) under SB 375 for achieved GHG reductions including:

- Green House Gas (GHG) reduction
- Vehicle Miles Travel (VMT) reduction
- Development and integration of public transit with multimodal rail, bicycle, and pedestrian infrastructure (Mode Shift)
- Significant expansion of equitable transportation opportunities to underserved communities
- Safety

2024 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN / SUSTAINABLE COMMUNTIES STRATEGY DEVELOPMENT

PREPARED BY: Ivan Garcia, Programming Director

ISSUE: BCAG is required to prepare and update the 2020 Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy by December 2024.

DISCUSSION: The RTP/SCS is adopted every 4 years to identify the region's long-range transportation plan for a 20-year minimum horizon. The 2024 RTP/SCS will cover the years from 2024 to 2050. The current RTP/SCS was adopted in December 2020. The 2024 RTP/SCS is scheduled to be adopted by December 2024. Once adopted, the RTP/SCS can be amended at any time by the BCAG Board.

The RTP/SCS serves as the foundation for the development of the short-range Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) and the Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP). Projects programmed in the RTIP and FTIP are required to be included in the RTP/SCS

The 2024 RTP/SCS will contain the following:

- RTP/SCS Document including all required elements (Policy, Action, Financial and the SCS)
- Air Quality Conformity Analysis and Determination demonstrating that the projects in the RTP/SCS conform to the applicable federal air quality requirements.
- 3. Environmental Impact Report complying with the California Environmental Quality Act requirements

Rincon Consultants, Inc. is being retained to complete the Environmental Impact Report. Progress on the Sustainable Communities Strategy is on schedule. The next step in the development of the RTP/SCS is to provide the draft list of projects anticipated over the horizon of the RTP/SCS. Staff met with the local jurisdictions on updating the current list. However, due to staff changes for several agencies, another review is necessary over the next couple of weeks.

Project Updates

The following questions need to be addressed for each project:

- 1. Has the project been completed since the 2020 RTP/SCS has been adopted / December 2020?
- 2. Is the project a carryover indicating that it has not been completed yet?
- 3. Are there changes to the scope, description, name, updated costs/schedule or emissions analysis year (for capacity increasing projects)?
- 4. Are the performance metrics reflected accurately for the project?
- 5. What new projects need to be included in the 2024 RTP/SCS?

ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM – CYCLE 7

PREPARED BY: Ivan Garcia, Programming Director

ISSUE: BCAG is hosting the California Transportation Commission's Active Transportation Program Kick-Off Workshop (North) on September 14, 2023.

DISCUSSION: The Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 7 workshop is expected to be funded at approximately \$550 million. The ATP Cycle 6 program was funded at \$1.5 billion due to the infusion of \$1 billion by the governor. During the review of the Cycle 6, it was analyzed how many projects would be funded had the infusion not been added and what would have been the cutoff score. CTC staff indicated that the cutoff score would have been a 97. Staff is bringing this to the committee's attention because funding will be 1/3 of Cycle 6 funding levels. This indicates that all projects really need to receive the maximum score for each application question.

The ATP program has increasingly become more competitive with project sizes also increasing.

Staff is encouraging locals to take advantage of the CTC ATP staff that will be at the BCAG offices for any assistance to ensure a highly competitive grant application is prepared.

A new version of LAPM 5-A (rev 09/2023) has been released. The major change from the previous version (rev 08/2020) is to the Invoice section where rows have been added to accommodate projects that have both federal and state funds.

For a project with both federal and state funds, an agency will be able to seek reimbursement for both types in the same column by entering both a state reimbursement percentage and a federal reimbursement percentage. Additional rows will be added to separate the federal and state amount that is reimbursed, as well as help track previous reimbursement amounts and remaining funds. Other updates include adding a Project End Date, revisions to the Section 4 Checklist, and minor text edits to the Instructions.
