Butte County Association of Governments Transportation Advisory Committee Draft Summary Meeting Minutes for April 7, 2022

Item #3 – February 3, 2022 BCAG TAC Meeting Minutes

No comments were received.

Item #4 - 2023 Federal Transportation Improvement Program Development

Staff informed the committee of the commencement of the development of the new 2023 FTIP. As the federally designated MPO for Butte County, BCAG is required to update the programming document every two years. The new FTIP will cover the next four federal fiscal years from FFY 22/23 through 25/26. Staff indicated that projects that have in the current FTIP and not obligated will be carried forward into the new document. Staff also reviewed the typical funding programs in the FTIP such as STIP, SHOPP, HBP, HSIP, CMAQ, ATP and FTA funds. Staff will reach out to each of the local agencies as the document is prepared.

These items were presented for the committee's awareness.

Item #5 - Draft Public Participation Plan Update

Staff informed the committee of the requirement to review and update BCAG's Public Participation Plan prior to the development of the next 2024 RTP/SCS. Staff indicated the draft PPP was available for review and comment and that the 45-day comment period had begun. Staff reviewed the public participation process taken with the committee including community outreach events and a zoom meeting. Staff indicated that minor language was included in the PPP to reflect the encouragement of community events such as farmers markets, health fairs or other events to encourage and engage community participation. In addition, the PPP includes remote meetings such as zoom or other applications as an acceptable method of participation. Staff indicated the PPP would be taken for approval at the next BCAG Board meeting scheduled for April 28, 2022. No comments were received.

Item #6 – Active Transportation Program – Cycle 6

Staff discussed the Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 6. A brief overview of the program objectives was discussed. Staff reminded the committee that the application due date was June 15, 2022.

Staff encouraged potential project sponsors to work with Butte County Public Health for non-infrastructure aspects of a potential project. Staff also requested that BCAG staff be made aware of potential projects that were being considered and encouraged new projects to be included in or consistent with BCAG's adopted Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy. The grant application and guidance references were hyperlinked as part of the agenda packet.

Item #7 – Fiscal Year 2022/23 Preliminary Findings of Apportionment for the Transportation Development Act (TDA) Funds.

Staff presented the preliminary 2022/23 Transportation Development Act (TDA) apportionments for the committee's awareness. Staff indicated that final apportionment figures will be developed after the state releases final population figures for January 1, 2022. This agenda item was presented to inform the Public Works Directors of the estimated LTF funds that can be used for bicycle and pedestrian projects as part of a potential ATP grant application or stand alone projects including local streets and roads. Staff indicated that the 2022/23 claim process will include a new requirement to identify which performance metric is achieved in order for BCAG to capture and include in its reporting requirements. Staff assured the members that the new requirement will not be burdensome.

Item #8 – Draft 2022/23 BCAG Overall Work Program & Budget

Staff informed the committee that BCAG's draft OWP & Budget was posted and available for review and comment. The OWP included 23 specific work elements that address state and federal planning and programming requirements as the designated RTPA and MPO for Butte County. Staff encouraged the committee members to review the work elements slated for the next fiscal year and to reach out to staff for any questions. Staff indicated that the BCAG Board was scheduled to adopt the OWP and Budget at the April 28, 2022 Board meeting.

2021 Federal Transportation Improvement Program - Amendment #6

ISSUE: BCAG has received a request from Caltrans and the Town of Paradise to amend the 2021 FTIP for various projects. Staff is requesting committee support on a request from the Town of Paradise for an additional \$100,000 in Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Program funds for their Oliver Curve project.

DISCUSSION: Amendment to the following programs & projects is requested as follows:

Highway Bridge Program (Grouped Listing)– Financial updates to the HBP program have been made by Caltrans. An updated grouped listing has been provided to BCAG. This amendment does not change the scope nor number of projects.

Highway Bridge Program (Individually Listed Projects). The Guynn Bridge project amendment reflects a financial change for the right of way component with moves from FY 21/22 to 23/24.

Highway Safety Improvement Program – An updated list of the HSIP program has been provided. The amendment makes financial changes without change to the list of projects.

State Minor Program – The State Minor Program (Grouped Listing) has been updated. This amendment programs a new project on State Route 99 at Keefer Slough to address deteriorating pavement and replace driveway culverts.

Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality Program – The Town of Paradise has requested an increase of scope and funding to their Oliver Rd Curve Project. This amendment moves \$100,000 in right-of-way funds to the preliminary engineering component and adds another \$100,000 in new CMAQ funds to fully fund the PE component. Based on feedback from Caltrans as part of the ATP grant application process for Cycle 5, Caltrans encouraged the Town to revise and increase the scope of the project to reflect full connectivity of a Class 1 bike path along Oliver Rd from Skyway to Bille Park. The additional funds will ensure the PE component is completed and increases the Town's

opportunity to better compete in the ATP Cycle 6 process. **Staff is requesting committee support for an additional \$100,000 in CMAQ funds.**

The Town of Paradise has also informed BCAG of additional needs on their other CMAQ funded projects originally programmed pre-COVID. Additional cost increase requests would be forthcoming.

The City of Chico has also requested any available funding for their Esplanade Corridor Safety and Accessibility Improvement Project. This project currently contains CMAQ, ATP and Local Funds. The City has identified a current unfunded need of \$1,349,000 and is requesting any available funding to ensure the project is fully funded. This project has an ATP commitment of \$7.2 million. BCAG's current CMAQ contribution is \$350,000 for preliminary engineering. The current cost estimate is \$11.8 million. The scope of the project is to construct various complete streets elements with a Class 1 path along the Esplanade from Memorial to W. 11th Avenue. Staff is currently reviewing all CMAQ projects programmed and will provide a recommendation at the June committee meeting.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff will be recommending that the BCAG Board of Directors approve the programming of an additional \$100,000 in CMAQ funds for the Town of Paradise Olive Curve Project. Staff is requesting committee support of this recommendation to the BCAG Board at the May 26, 2022, Board meeting.

ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM – CYCLE 6

PREPARED BY: Ivan Garcia, Transportation Programming Specialist

ISSUE: Project applications for new Active Transportation Projects are due by June 15, 2022.

DISCUSSION: The Active Transportation Program (ATP) is a competitive statewide program created to encourage increased use of active modes of transportation, such as biking and walking. Senate Bill 99 (Chapter 359, Statutes of 2013) and Assembly Bill 101 (Chapter 354, Statutes of 2013) created the ATP, and Senate Bill 1 (SB 1) (Chapter 2031, statutes of 2017) directs additional funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account to the ATP.

The goals of the ATP are to:

- 1. Increase the proportion of trips accomplished by biking and walking.
- 2. Increase the safety and mobility for nonmotorized users.
- 3. Advance the active transportation efforts of regional agencies to achieve greenhouse gas reduction goals as established pursuant to Senate Bill 375 (Chapter 728, Statutes of 2008) and Senate Bill 391 (Chapter 585, Statutes of 2009).
- 4. Enhance public health, including reduction of childhood obesity through the use of programs including, but not limited to, projects eligible for Safe Routes to School Program funding.
- 5. Ensure that disadvantaged communities fully share in the benefits of the program.
- 6. Provide a broad spectrum of projects to benefit many types of active transportation users.

In addition to the goals listed in statute, the ATP will also consider state goals and provisions set forth in the Climate Action Plan for Transportation Infrastructure (CAPTI).

A "Call-for-Projects" was formally noticed at the March 16-17 CTC meetings. Applications are due by June 15, 2022. The CTC is scheduled to make its draft project nominations on October 21, 2023.

SB 1 created the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Program to address deferred maintenance on the state highway as well as on local streets and roads. After deducting amounts for other appropriations in the annual Budget Act, the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account shall make available \$100 million annually for expenditure on the ATP. Combined with existing resources, the **ATP Program is expected to provide approximately \$651 million over the 2023 ATP Fund Estimate period for active transportation projects between the State and regions**. The 2023 ATP Program will cover the next four fiscal years including 2023-24 through 2026-27.

Staff would like to hear what projects will be recommended for ATP Cycle 6 from the cities, county, or any other agency.
