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BCAG is also responsible for preparing and adopting a Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP). The FTIP is a programming document that identifies all transportation projects from the RTP/SCS that are funded with federal transportation funds or require some type of approval from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) or Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for projects in Butte County. This programming document covers a four federal fiscal year cycle and is updated every two years. Projects identified in the FTIP typically include:

- Streets and roads
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BCAG has initiated the development of the new 2025 FTIP. The BCAG Board is scheduled to adopt this document at the September 26, 2024, Board meeting. All information is posted online at: <http://www.bcag.org/Planning/FTIP/index.html>
